The command of our Lord Jesus Christ that we make disciples has always been the ongoing responsibility of each generation of the true church. If we fail to disciple this generation we fail our Lord. It is the calling of the Lord on my life to walk with Him and learn of Him. While I have had extensive formal training in theology, including studying the scriptures in their original languages, I can not say that I feel like I have been fully discipled. However, in my personal walk with Jesus through life I have learned what I hope are the basic essentials of what a disciple needs to know to be spiritually balanced. The desire of my heart is to share a more systematic presentation of the elements of discipleship revealed in the scriptures focusing on the Lord Jesus and those whom He discipled.

- II. Disciples must use the same standard for authority that Jesus used.

Jesus consistently used the scriptures of the Bible of His day for His authority. We believe that the scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, while written by men, are divinely inspired and without error in the original

manuscripts. We believe that they have God for their author, salvation for their purpose and truth without any mixture of error for their matter. The Bible reveals the principles by which God judges us; and therefore is, and will remain to the end of the world the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. The Bible testifies of itself that it is God breathed 2 Timothy 3: 16; flawless (without error) Psalms 12: 6; 18: 30; the standard by which we will be judged John 12: 48; and that we are not to add to nor take away from its words Deuteronomy 4: 2, Proverbs 30: 5-6, Revelation 22: 18 - 19

III. Disciples must know about Jehovah God

The Bible clearly teaches that there is only one living an true God. He is an intelligent, spiritual, and personal Being, the Creator, Redeemer, Preserver, and Ruler of the universe. He is infinite in His holiness and all other perfections. God is all powerful and all knowing; and His perfect knowledge extends to all things, past, present, and future, including the future decisions of His free creatures. To Him we owe the highest love, reverence, and obedience. The eternal triune God reveals Himself to us as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, with distinct personal attributes, but without division of nature, essence, or being. (2000 BFM)

A. God the Father

God as Father reigns with providential care over His universe, His creatures and the flow of the stream of human history according to the purpose of His grace. God is Father in truth only to those who become children of God through faith in Jesus Christ. (BFM)

B. God the Son

Jesus Christ is the one and only eternal Son of God. In His one and only incarnation as Jesus of Nazareth, He was conceived by a work of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary. Jesus perfectly revealed and did the will of God by taking upon Himself real humanity, identifying Himself completely with mankind yet without sin. He honored the divine law of by His personal obedience, and in His death on the cross He made provision for the redemption of mankind from sin. He was raised from the dead with a glorified body and appeared to His disciples as the person who was with them before His crucifixion. He ascended into heaven and is now at the right hand of God where He is the One Mediator, partaking of the nature of God and of man, and in whose person is effected the reconciliation between God and man. He will return in power and glory to judge the world and to consummate His redemptive mission. He now dwells in all believers as the living and ever present Lord.

C. God the Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity. He inspired holy

Men of old to write the scriptures. Through Illumination He enables believers to understand truth. He exalts Jesus Christ. He convicts of sin, of righteousness, and of judgment. He calls mankind the Savior, and effects regeneration. He cultivates Christian character, comforts believers, and bestows the spiritual gifts by which they serve God through His church. He seals the believer unto the day of final redemption. His presence in the Christian is the assurance of God to bring the believer into the fullness of the stature of Christ. He enlightens and empowers the believer and the church in worship, evangelism, and service.

VI. The Kingdom

The Kingdom of God is the realm of salvation into which people enter by trustful, childlike commitment to Jesus Christ. Christians ought to pray and to labor that the Kingdom may come and God's will be done on earth as it is in heaven. The full consummation of the Kingdom awaits the return of Jesus Christ and the end of this age. (BFM)

D: Kingdom Multiplied (the Church)

A New Testament church of the Lord Jesus Christ is a local body of baptized believers who are associated by covenant in the faith and fellowship of the

gospel, observing the two ordinances of Christ, committed to His teachings, exercising the gifts, rights, and privileges invested in them by the Word, and

seeking to extend the gospel to the ends of the earth. This church is an autonomous body, operating through democratic processes under the Lordship of Jesus Christ. In such a congregation, members are equally

responsible. Its scriptural officers are pastors and deacons. The New Testament also speaks of the church as the body of Christ which includes all of the redeemed of all the ages. (BFM)

The Church is the local gathering of the Kingdom of God which is made up of baptized believers in Jesus Christ the Messiah King. Many times people talk of the church as if it is not one and the same as the Kingdom of God and our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ this is a misconception scripturally.

VII. VII. Salvation

Salvation is God's gift, of forgiving our sins against Him. Salvation is made available to us by God's grace when we believe in Jesus as our Savior and Lord, repenting of our sins. Salvation involves the redemption of the whole man, and is offered freely to all who accept Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

Jesus, by his own blood, obtained this salvation guaranteeing the believer eternal redemption. In its broadest sense salvation includes regeneration, sanctification, and glorification. (BFM)
