- Makes money for city government


Panhandler Profiles

- Post signs not very effective
- Homeless shelters work for some people
- The Link a short start toward sobriety

- Drive around town, offer beggars a day job
- Pull weeds, remove litter, patch roads, shovel snow, ...
- Offer support services after the day's labor

- Professional beggars working their "career"
- Sometimes they have nice cars but *pretend* to be poor

Potential New Ordinance

- Write a truth in panhandling ordinance
- People above an income/asset threshold must post a disclaimer that reads "I have money" on their "anything helps" sign that implies they're poor
- Similar to truth in advertising laws
